



Indonesian Dana At Home In Singapore

Patience was the key to victory for Indonesian **Dana** in the third leg of the Heritage SG Tour at Singapore's Keppel Club.

"I've always played pretty well when coming to Singapore. Patience was the key for me," said Dana (*pictured*), who claimed the top prize with a 36-hole total of one-over-par 145.

Winner of a tournament at Laguna National Golf & Country Club in 2002, the teaching professional from Jakarta continued to display his liking for Singapore's courses, managing his game expertly around the tight Keppel layout.

One shot clear of compatriot and former national team mate **Sarmilih** after an opening 70, Dana led by three with two holes remaining before running up a double-bogey at 17.

Holding his nerve, however, Dana made a safe par at the last for a second-round 75 to stay in front of Sarmilih by the narrowest of margins. Four strokes off the pace in third position was Australian **Gavin Flint**.

Dana, who collected a cheque for S\$2,600 (about US\$1,707), said: "It was great to win here, especially as we were invited by Heritage. This win will be a boost to my confidence."
